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#### Introduction

### Cancer and Respiratory Diseases

- Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD): Leading cause of death due to smoking.
- Asthma: Exacerbates symptoms and worsens control.
- ▶ **Respiratory Infections**: Increased risk of pneumonia, bronchitis, tuberculosis.

# Cardiovascular Diseases and Reproductive and Developmental Effects

- ▶ Heart Disease: Contributes to coronary artery disease and heart attacks.
- Stroke: Increases the risk of ischemic and hemorrhagic strokes.
- Peripheral Artery Disease (PAD): Reduces blood flow to limbs, leading to amputation.
- ▶ **Infertility**: Reduced fertility in both men and women.
- Pregnancy Complications: Higher risks of preterm birth, low birth weight, stillbirth, and placental problems.
- Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS): Increased risk in infants exposed to tobacco smoke.

### Weakened Immune System

- ▶ Smoking weakens the immune system, making individuals more vulnerable to infections and autoimmune diseases.
- It also impairs wound healing and the ability to fight diseases.

## Other Health Consequences and Secondhand Smoke

- Premature Aging: Smoking accelerates skin aging, causing wrinkles and a dull complexion.
- ▶ **Diabetes**: Increases risk of type 2 diabetes by affecting insulin resistance and inflammation.
- Health Risks for Nonsmokers: Linked to respiratory problems, heart disease, and cancer.
- ▶ **Vulnerable Populations**: Children and pregnant women are particularly at risk.
