



Fairness as it manifests in society.


Ensuring everyone in a community has access to the same opportunities and outcomes.



Kenya's position


- Alcohol is the most consumed substance in Kenya.
- ☐ Effort made by Government to control the problem associated with the use of alcohol through licensing and regulation.





Regulatory Framework

- ☐ Alcoholic Drinks Control Act, (*No. 4/2010*) and County government specific legislation.
- Among others, controls production, manufacture, sale, labeling, promotion, and consumption of alcoholic drinks to ensure the protection of the health of individuals.
- □ Champions for adoption and implementation of effective measures to eliminate illicit trade in alcohol including smuggling, illicit manufacturing and counterfeiting.




The Transition

- □ Repeal of the *Chang'aa* Prohibition Act (*Cap 70*) and the Liquor Licensing Act (*Cap 121*).
- ☐ Development of specification for production of Traditional Spirits(*Chang'aa*);


KS 2326:2011

- ☐ Training of brewer on applicable regulatory mechanisms;
- ☐ Setting up of Alternative livelihoods for reformed brewers.



Bottlenecks

- ☐ High cost of requisite permits and attendant requirements lock out manufacturers of traditional/local brews and acts as catalyst for illicit production.
 ☐ Attitudes and perceptions.
- ☐ Number /safety of law enforcement officers- hinders absolute executing of policy on illicit alcohol.
- ☐ Conflict of interest in the "lucrative" business.
- ☐ Lack of policy coherence.



Take Home

- ☐ Focused regulatory efforts and policy cohesiveness.
- ☐ Resource allocation for targeted capacity building effortseffects of illicit alcohol, adherence to standards as well as championing of alternative livelihood.
- ☐ Restorative approaches for those communities most affected by addiction, high crime rate and poverty.
