

Introduction

- Good mental health allows individuals to live a meaningful and fulfilling life where they fully exert themselves and pursue their dreams and aspirations and is an important factor in development.
- Mental, neurological and substance use disorders including alcohol are important mental health problems
- Uganda is reported to have one of the highest levels of alcohol consumption with annual per capita of 23.7 Litres
- Up to 16% of the population in Kyenjojo consume alcohol.
- Alcohol use is associated with ill health, road accidents, HIV infection, partner violence among other problems
- Districts grapple with limited capacity to deal with alcohol abuse and other mental health problems, there is limited documentation of effective technical support mechanisms.

Introduction II

- Kyenjojo is located in the mid-western region with 507,100 people 50% are female, 56% are under 18 years and 9.3% have lost at least one parent
- Only 61% of the population is within 5KMs of a health facility There are 3 Health Sub Districts and 48 health units including 1 General Hospital, 2 HC IVs, 11 HC IIIs, 14 HCIIs.
- Despite the high magnitude of alcohol abuse and mental problems the district did not have a clear response plan
- Uzima Ministries a Christian Non Profit Organization
- Established with the aim of reaching out to individuals and families afflicted by mental health problems.
- It is a response to Jesus' call "go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature heal the sick"

- b. Identification of focal person to serve as a link between Uzima ministries and the district
- c. Working with district staff as opposed to recruiting new project staff
- d. Jointly conducting a situation analysis to identify gaps
- e. Using the findings to inform the development of the district mental health workplan

Approach to the collaboration II

- a. Collaboration in the development, implementation and monitoring of the mental health work plan. Key interventions described in the work plan include
 - ✓ Strengthening leadership and prioritization of the mental health response in Kyenjojo District
 - ✓ Raising awareness for mental health and Mobilization of communities to take up MH services
 - ✓ Improving diagnosis and treatment for mental disorders at health facilities in Kyenjojo District
 - ✓ Strengthening coordination of Mental health services in Kyenjojo District
 - ✓ Advocacy for policy changes to improve access to, prevention and delivery of MH services in Kyenjojo District

Achievements Noted


- a. Harmonious implementation of activities
- b. Joint commemoration of the world mental health day the first of its kind in the region
- c. Needs based mental health technical support e.g., work plan addressing key issues such as epilepsy, substance abuse, etc.
- d. Support from all levels of the district including the district Health team, the executive committee and the council plus private sector
- e. District Council Resolution for setting up a mental health ward at the general hospital





Gaps/Challenges

- a. Policy of not having mental health staff at Health Centre IIIs
- b. Lack of nationally accepted indicators for tracking progress of mental health response
- c. Limited infrastructure for managing mental health services e.g., wards for admitting aggressive/ violent patients as arrangements for referral are being made





Future Plans/Next Steps

- 1. Continue to support implementation of planned activities including advocacy
- 2. Follow up on the council resolution for a ward
- 3. Mobilize stakeholders to continue supporting mental health work
- 4. Track and report the implementation of activities
